I look forward to speaking to you and meeting you in the future, thank you for your interest in our school. Best wishes

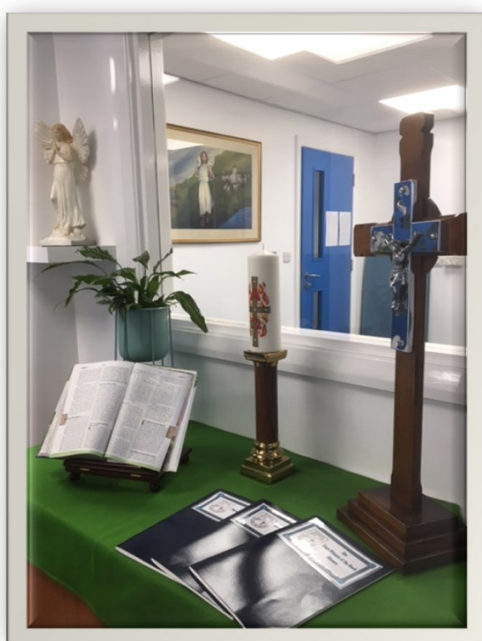

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School Times

School starts at 8.45am and finishes at 3.00pm. Before school, children should be on the yard, ready to line up at 8.40am. It's vital that your child arrives on time.

After school, children should be collected at 3.00pm. Please do ensure that your child is collected on time at the end of the day.

Lunch break is from 12noon to 12.45pm. Our school kitchen always prepares healthy lunches and the children have a choice each day. School lunches are provided free of charge to all EYFS and KS1 pupils under the Government's Universal Free School Meal Scheme. Children in KS2 can also enjoy a meal from our kitchen for £2.30 per day.

(Due to Covid-19 restrictions, we are currently operating staggered start and finishing times.)

Attendance

If your child is unable to attend school, please contact us by telephone (01282 438120) as soon as possible.

You must tell us why. Please tell us the nature of their illness rather than just saying poorly or unwell. We need to know that your child is safe if he/she does not arrive at school in the morning.

If we do not hear from you by 10am, we will ring you. If we cannot speak to you we will leave a message asking you to ring back. If we have not heard from you by the following morning and your child is still not in school, we will carry out a home visit.

Morning milk and fruit

All EYFS and KS1 children receive a piece of fruit daily and have access to drinking water throughout the day. We also provide a drink of milk each morning to EYFS children, this is free of charge.

We encourage children to bring a water bottle into school to have on their desk so that they can keep hydrated throughout the day.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Breakfast Club is open every morning 8am—8.45am and is run by school staff, Miss Bradley and Miss Holt.

Children attending Breakfast Club should arrive between 8am and 8.10am and must be signed in by an adult. It costs £2 per day and includes a healthy breakfast. Limited places are available and are offered on a random-draw basis. If you need Breakfast Club provision, please ask for a separate letter and application form.

After School Club is open every day 3pm-5.30pm and is also run by our staff, Mrs Hargreaves (After School Club Manager) and Miss Martin. It costs £8.50 per day. A separate letter is available if you are interested in this provision.

We have recently introduced ParentPay as we are now a cashless school. All parents and carers are given details once their child starts school.

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Our Curriculum

At St John's we aspire to help every child reach their full potential as a child of God. Our school policies reflect our school's commitment to an inclusive, creative and exciting curriculum, based around high quality teaching and learning with our Catholic faith at its centre.

We want all learners to receive a high-quality, ambitious education. We aim:

1. to ensure that a good, well-taught curriculum enables pupils to know more and do more;
2. for our children to grow in knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the world and that they aspire to achieve more and be the best they can be;
3. for our children to be strong, fit and active;
4. for our children to enjoy a strong practical curriculum.

We feel that it is very important that home and school work closely together to enable your child to confidently face the challenges in life that lie ahead. Class 1 is extremely well prepared to provide children with the very best early start to education. Mrs Wilkinson and her staff work hard to ensure that the first year of school life is happy and successful.



Religious Education

The Catholic nature of our school is at the centre of school life and we hope that children gradually and joyfully become aware of belonging to God's family. Children will be involved in collective worship, assemblies, school masses and special feast days. Parents and carers are invited to join events which link the home, school and parish community of St John's. Whilst at St John's, children are invited to complete the Sacramental Programme and continue on their spiritual journey to become full members of the Catholic Church.

PE and Sport

We encourage all children to take part in physical activity and sport at St John's. KS2 pupils attend Fitness Club every day as well as twice-weekly PE lessons.

Our school teams perform very well. This year our football team won the Burnley finals and represented our town in the regional finals at Fleetwood. Our Indoor Athletics team represented Burnley also at the Blackpool regional finals.

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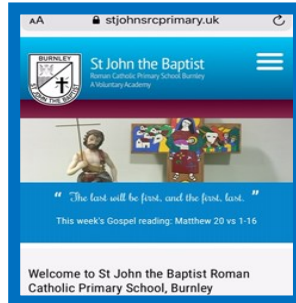
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Home/School Communication

During the year we have two Parents' and Carers' Evenings, one in the Autumn Term and one in the Summer Term. We also have drop-in sessions after school each 1/2 term. These are usually on Mondays 3-4pm, no appointments necessary just call in.

Leave during term time

Your child needs to be in school everyday and we do all we can to eliminate unnecessary absence. Leave during term time is only allowed under exceptional circumstances. Our Attendance Policy gives more information. It is available from the Office and is based on legislation from the Department for Education. **Leave during term time will not be authorised for family holidays.**

We hope that parents and carers will acknowledge and understand the limitations placed on schools in granting any leave in term time. We ask that you support our efforts to reduce unnecessary absence, thus minimising the impact on the education of your child. Please note that penalty notices (fines) will be issued for unauthorised holidays.



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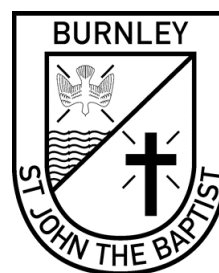
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Behaviour and Discipline

We have a set of rules in school which we keep as simple as possible so they can be understood by even the youngest child. If your child does have any behaviour problems in school, you will be asked to come in and discuss the matter with a member of the Senior Leadership Team. School Uniform

Sweatshirts, cardigans and bookbags with our school logo on are available from Whittakers at Pendle Village Mill, Brierfield (next to B&Q at junction 12, M65).

Boys: Grey trousers or shorts; white or blue polo shirt and maroon top with school logo (sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan).

Girls: Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts; white or blue polo shirt and maroon top with school logo (sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan). Blue summer dresses in summer months.

Footwear: Only plain black shoes with no logos are allowed. Boots and boot-style shoes are not allowed.

PE: Plain white tee shirt; black shorts; black slip-on pumps; trainers for outdoor use. All children should have a PE kit bag, which they can keep on their coat hook.

Hair: Extreme hairstyles, including unnatural colours or decorative braids and beads are not allowed. Extreme haircuts for example tramlines, shaven heads (number 2 cut or less) and decorative designs are not allowed.

Jewellery: No jewellery or make-up is allowed. Children may wear a watch. If your child has their ears pierced, small plain gold or silver stud type earrings only are allowed. All jewellery must be removed before any PE activity. Please do not send your child to school wearing earrings on a day when they have PE.

Toys and Belongings: Toys and personal belongings are not allowed in school.

Mobile Phones: Mobile phones are not allowed in school
