1	To support pupil's social, emotional and behaviour needs		
2	To identify barriers to learning as soon as possible and provide immediate corrective intervention.		
3	High quality first teaching to enable pupils to catch up.		
4	To reduce absenteeism in identified groups.		
5	To increase interest and raise aspirations for the future in order to prepare for success in next steps.		

## 3. Barriers to learning:

- 1. Our assessments and observations indicate that the education and wellbeing of many our disadvantaged pupils have been impacted by the disruption to education during the pandemic. This has resulted in significant gaps in their learning leading to pupils falling further behind age-related expectations in reading, writing and maths.
- 2. A high number of DP pupils at St John's have additional needs (22/33 pupils on SEND register are DP), 32% of DP are SEND pupils, 71% of pupils with an EHCP are DP
- 3. A significant number of DP children in EYFS and KS 1 have speech and languages needs (EYFS 100% Sp and L intervention 20/23)
- 4. Limited life experiences and aspirations of some DP children
- 5. Persistent absenteeism In 2022/23 6% of DP girls were PA. 0% of DP boys are PA. 31% of PA children are DP girls and all are girls.
